During our vacation in Montana, not only did we soak up our grandson Felix, his parents, Nate and Julia, and spend time with Bekah and Yogi, we visited Blackfoot Pathways: Sculpture in the Wild Park. This Park included a dozen sculptures that helped the visitor connect to the wildness and beauty of Big Sky country.

One sculpture, by Alison Sigora, stood out to us, called "Clearing." This Sculpture looked like a large nest, the outside was created of burnt wood logs. (in Montana, like the rest of the west, wildfires are a part life.) The diameter and height were more than 12 feet. It was imposing and seemingly unwelcoming until one entered it through a door that brought one to a space where smooth native wood planks lined the whole inside, and a bench was attached to the curved walls. In this space one left the unpredictable and sometimes harsh world behind, and one entered a sanctuary of sorts, with the only connection to the outside being, at that time, the blue skies of Montana.



World Hunger: How Does Your Garden Grow?

Most everything has been harvested from the vegetable garden by now. But in the southern hemisphere, it is spring and time for planting. In Chile, Maria Carrasco has worked since 1985 with a program, founded in 1982 by an ELCA missionary, called Educacion Popular en Salud (EPES). Supported by ELCA World Hunger, EPES trains students, public officials, health and education workers, and women from vulnerable communities to advocate for the rights to health care and sustainable food. As a response to Covid-19, EPES proposed to start community gardening workshops online. The problem is, in Maria's neighborhood, there are very few green spaces for gardening. But she learned how to improve soil quality and reduce waste by composting, and to work with natural light and the space she had. Soon, arugula, chard, and spinach were growing in the 6-foot walkway to her front door. In Chile, as in many other countries, people experiencing poverty are especially vulnerable to illnesses caused by poor nutrition. Add to this the pandemic, and food has become expensive and difficult to access. Cultivating community gardens gives families greater autonomy and assures them access to fresh produce. 


