

Augustana Summer Outreach Focus: Model Evangelical Primary School Roknola Village, Sierra Leone

In last month's newsletter, there were maps and photos explaining that Augustana supports a school in Sierra Leone. Our support of the school originated from our sponsorship of the Sesay family.

In 2001, Augustana sponsored the Sesay family to come to Buffalo from Sierra Leone, in West Africa. At the time, the nation was experiencing a civil war.

Through the Sesays, we have been involved with the Sierra Leone Cultural Alliance of WNY (SLCA of WNY) and the Evangelical Model Primary School in Sierra Leone. For several years, the people of Augustana have been supporting the children who attend the school by providing money for food. We now also provide funds that go toward building a new school.

Alan Sesay will be at Augustana on Sunday, July 11 to speak about the school and answer questions, immediately after the church service ends.

We look forward to Alan's visit with us and to learning more about the school.

We received our second grant fund payment of \$3000 from Lutheran Charities for 2021. Last two months we had 6 new individuals start their driving lessons. Also two previous participants have started up their driving lessons again.

Erie County is still testing procedures for individuals to go online to take the written permit test. They are working with High Schools on testing the procedures. We will be having a permit class starting in July.

Also we are working on a raffle fundraiser for this year.

"DREAMS COME TRUE"

Marcia informs congregations about the impact of the ELCA's missions, which are made possible by the donations of congregations. This is her article for July:

Chhani Marandi used to be a domestic worker. She is 24, lives in Nepal, and always dreamed of being a health care professional, inspired by her father's health problems. He died when she was 5, and her older siblings had to leave school and work to support the family. Chhani herself started to do domestic work in third grade to pay for her own education, eventually graduating from 10th grade. Then she heard about a scholarship program from the Lutheran Community Welfare Society, a partner of Lutheran World Federation in Nepal. This is one of many projects supported by ELCA World Hunger that create opportunities for women.

After 18 months of study, Chhani completed her training as an auxiliary nurse midwife, and now works at Anjali Hospital. She plans to also provide health services to her community by phone, and to continue her training so she can provide free care to families in poverty. "It was my dream to be a health worker since the time my family could not afford proper treatments for my father," Chhani said. "I got the opportunity to fulfill my dream from the Lutheran World Federation in Nepal. I realized that it was 'God's grace to me and my dreams.'

it looking good?



We are working on making some of the garden areas smaller. The next project is moving small landscaping 'stones' and then planting grass seed. Our thought with perennials is to keep the native wildflowers that are already in the gardens. Also, Donna planted some native seeds in the fall and is nurturing them.
