### Pastor's Ponderings:

I recently attended a coach training session in Baltimore, MD. This conference was held at Christ Lutheran Church. On its campus the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS) has its office. At the office I was able to get a button that states "Welcome the Stranger" Matthew 25, and a sticker that says "Jesus was a Refugee." (remember Herod was trying to kill them and Joseph, Mary and Jesus left their home and went to Egypt)

The Bible is clear that it is our duty to help the refugee. The Bible is clear that no country is ordained to be "the" country. All countries are filled with special children of God; so it is imperative that we stand for those who are unfortunate to be in danger in their country of origin. It is imperative that we provide relief, shelter and hope. I stand with the Immigrant and Refugee.

"I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Matthew 25:31-46 Verse upon verse in the Old Testament also points to the duty of those who believe in God to care for the refugee and immigrant: "..do not deprive a resident alien... of justice." Deut. 24:17-18, "you shall not wrong or oppress a resident alien," Exodus 22:21, and "The Lord watches over the strangers." Psalm 146:9

Paul Kennedy, director for the Refugee and Immigrant Driving program at Augustana, shared a concern with me. He stated that a number of people who are in the country legally, have the correct papers, and have gone through the training for getting a driver's license are afraid, and will not pursue this important skill and opportunity. This is tragic because a license helps them be productive, drive to jobs, fulfill the requirements of the government for establishing United States as their residence, they are afraid. These and other aliens have shared of the horror happening in their own countries, and it is not safe for women, children and families to live normal lives. Violence, intimidation, and oppression are rampant.

Let us pray, welcome, and help the United States address this humanitarian situation with a safe, dignified way for people to assimilate into our culture. In the not so distant past, many of our descendants were welcomed at Ellis Island.

With a heavy heart, and strong motivation, I write this letter to share a part of the challenge people face.
